During COVID, the number of international students in Australia dropped drastically. However since Australia's doors reopened, statistics show that we will surpass our 2019 peak.

Australian universities now have the highest percentage of international to domestic students in the world.

This is a huge mission-field for us as we seek to double the number of those who hear the gospel and are invited to trust in Jesus as Lord, and double the number of those who are willing to take the gospel to the nations.

Brianna, an Apprentice, shares an example of this:

I met Jane*, an international student from Chile. She had had significant experiences with many other religions, which clouded her understanding of Jesus. Through reading John's Gospel together, Jane came to greater clarity about Jesus as her Lord through learning how to carefully read God's Word. As we farewelled Jane, she shared how she had grown a love for reading the Bible to understand who Jesus is, and was keen to share Jesus and read the Bible with her family back home. We have put her in contact with a staff worker from GBU in Chile, praying that she will continue to grow in understanding the true gospel and remain eager to share Jesus with those around her in Chile.
